

COVID-19 Plan for Students
School Opening 2021-2022

Plan is subject to change based on guidance from the CDC, the MS Department of Health, orders by the Governor and/or local decisions.

<p>Transportation</p>	<p>Bus drivers, bus aides, and students will be required to wear masks/face covering. Hand sanitizer will be available on every bus. When possible, windows will be open on buses to maintain a free flow of air through the bus while on routes.</p> <p>Car Riders – Students will arrive at school and have their temperature checked when they exit their vehicle.</p> <p>Bus Riders – Students will be required to wear masks/face coverings on the bus. Students will ride one to a seat, if possible, unless with a household member. Student temperatures will be checked as they exit the bus and enter the building.</p> <p>Walkers – Students will have their temperature checked prior to entering the building.</p> <p>Parents are encouraged to bring children to school and pick them up. Buses will be sanitized at the conclusion of each route.</p>
<p>Temperature Checks for Students</p>	<p>Temperature checkers will be required to wear masks/face covering. Hand sanitizer will be available at every entry point. All students will have their temperature checked before entering the school building. Students with elevated temperatures will be re-scanned. A student who has a temperature 100.4 degrees or above, will be quarantined and required to go home. We are asking parents to check temperatures of students before they leave for school. We are asking parents to make sure students wash hands before leaving for school.</p>
<p>Sick Students</p>	<p>Students identified with symptoms will be quarantined in a supervised isolation area with a mask/face covering. Parents will be contacted to pick up his/her child immediately. School procedures to minimize campus entry will be used when sick students are picked up.</p>
<p>Masks/Face Coverings</p>	<p>Masks/face coverings will be worn while students are in the buildings. Students may purchase different themed masks/face coverings to wear that are appropriate for school. Our goal is to take every precaution to protect our students and employees from exposure to COVID-19.</p>
<p>Personal Hygiene</p>	<p>Students will wash their hands with soap for 20 seconds and are encouraged to refrain from touching their face. Hand sanitizer will be located throughout the building in public spaces. Students will be given multiple opportunities per day to wash their hands. The school district will have hand sanitizer available throughout buildings for student and employee use. Parents are encouraged to purchase personal hand sanitizers for their students to use.</p>
<p>Water Bottles</p>	<p>Students are encouraged to bring a clean filled water bottle each day. They are encouraged to have the water bottle filled prior to arrival.</p>
<p>Classroom Distancing</p>	<p>Classrooms will be arranged to achieve the greatest level of distancing for students. Students will be spaced in classrooms to avoid contact. Cleaning solutions will be available for every classroom. Students will</p>

	have hand sanitizer available to frequently clean hands. Each classroom will have disinfectant to use to keep student surfaces clean.
Student Check-ins and Check-outs	Each school has a procedure for students to check-in and check-out that minimizes parent/guardian entry to the building. Students who check in will have their temperatures checked before entering. Students with temperatures 100.4 degrees or above will not be allowed to check in to school.
Student Hallway Travel/Class Change	Students will wear masks/face coverings while making class changes. All students will walk on the right side of the hallway in the direction of their class. They will avoid physical contact with other students and distance to the best of their ability.
Student Nutrition	Students will follow cafeteria guidelines during breakfast and lunch times. Hand sanitizer will be available in the cafeteria.
Technology Chromebooks Google Classroom	In the event of extended virtual attendance, students in grades K-12 will be able to checkout a Chromebook for home use. Chromebooks will be used in the traditional environment with each student assigned a device in the classroom. Students (grades 9-12) will have an assigned Chromebook and parents are encouraged to ensure the Chromebook is fully charged and ready for school daily. Sanitize technology devices by spraying a cloth with an alcohol-based solution (do NOT soak cloth, just dampen) and wipe the device. Never spray anything directly onto a technology device. Never use bleach or ammonia products on technology devices. Students will utilize Google Classroom for virtual and traditional instruction. Teachers will assign online assignments and examinations whenever possible to reduce the amount of paper assignments. One-to-one technology will provide a continuity of learning if a student is quarantined.
Mental Health-Whole Child Education	Our school district has developed procedures to assist students with resources to manage student mental health. Counseling is available at each campus to help students deal with mental health issues to include stresses endured during COVID-19.
Teacher/Parent Communication	The district will continue to use School Status Communications as our parent/teacher communication portal. It is very important that parents are responsive to our communication and provide feedback when requested. Parent-teacher conferences arranged through multiple online platforms will minimize the need for in-person contact. Some face-to-face meetings will be required and scheduled.
Attendance Policy	Parents are encouraged to keep their children home when they are ill or not feeling well. Students who must quarantine will be required to provide medical excuses. We are asking that parents notify their school within three hours of a COVID-19 diagnosis. Students who are out will be required to make up all school work. This will require the parents and the school to communicate regarding assignments.
